1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

Department meetings were very successful. I was able to have great conversations about curriculum and courses with each department. A lot of revisions were made to the course catalog to give the students more information on the classes they are taking. Overall we are very excited about the process of improving curriculum and instruction using the Learning for All principals. Teachers are also looking forward to being able to meet and be part of professional dialog bi-weekly next year.

We are entering the start of testing season at the middle and high school. The first assessment will be the junior ACT and WorkKeys assessments the end of February. We have continued to provide updates in regards to the incentives that were put forth for the juniors in ACT prep. We are working on a plan to provide leadership opportunities for the freshman, have the sophomore students take the ASVAB and all the seniors the day to apply for colleges, work on scholarships or apply for summer jobs.

School Board Report and Update School/Building –District-Wide Director of Special Education, Pupil and Learning Services -Amanda Jones February 13, 2018

1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

- Training and preparation for Dynamic Learning Map (DLM alternative assessment to Forward Exam for students with significant intellectual disabilities) is being completed with staff. Testing window March 19 -May 4, 2018.
- Further work on the English Learner Program Guidebook continues, per the guidelines outlined by DPI. This includes categories such as identification, screening, progress monitoring, assessment, and program model as an overall umbrella of areas identified within the plan. The board will have an opportunity to look over and approve this plan before it's final approval to the state.
- Special education staff continue to discuss and move forward with how Learning for All can allow this team of educators to promote collaboration between special education and regular education staff. This foundation has been laid with special education staff and they will continue to move forward by having collaboration time to outline current programming and utilization of data and collaboration through the district to better inform and identify areas of improvement to promote successful student outcomes.
- The newly released Co-Teaching Toolkit will be introduced at the February Special Education meeting. Further co-teaching resources, plans and pilot implementation will be discussed for the 2018/19 school year.
