1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

- Middle/High School intervention/Rtl will be continued to be evaluated by Andy Pickett, Nick Jones and myself throughout the summer as we evaluate student data and current Rtl/intervention systems, processes and tools. A more comprehensive version of MAP assessment was given in the spring for students scoring 60% or lower on the winter MAP assessment, which will provide sub areas of more accurate identification of intervention needs as well as inform improved universal instruction practices and training.
- A variety of research-based supplemental math and literacy intervention programs were purchased with IDEA flow through funds to better support students in these areas to utilize during specially designed instruction to better close achievement gaps between students with disabilities and their same-aged peers. Teachers will/have received formal training in these materials.
