1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

- English/language arts curriculum is complete for kindergarten, grade one and grade one. Grades 3-6 will be finished before the end of March. The curriculum lists the standard that aligns with the common core and the learning targets that will be taught to meet the standard. Once all grades are completed, the curriculum will be reviewed across all grade levels for continuity of learning targets and then grade levels will develop instructional timelines.
- A balance literacy curriculum guide is being developed as an addendum to the elementary English/language arts curriculum. This guide will define district terminology and define instructional practice.
- Professional development in comprehension of non-fiction texts and writing in narrative, informational and opinion genres have begun in both elementary schools. This is being led by teams of teachers and the elementary principals.
- I am continuing to attend informational webinars on the new testing for the Badger Exam and for Aspire and ACT. I have been sharing information as needed. Much of the work has been in making sure the technology capabilities of the district will support the testing. I have been working with Patrice on this.

We are busy getting ready for the next round of testing in spring. On Thursday, February 4th a meeting was held after school to discuss the Dynamic Learning Maps, the new alternate assessment.

1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

Winter benchmarks in AIMSweb and MAP testing have been completed for 7th and 8th grade along with 9th grade MAP testing. We put an incentive plan in place for student achievement in the 7th and 8th grade and it seems to have motivated students to do their best. The data analysis action team is currently going through all the data and preparing it to be released to staff members to help drive instruction.

I meet with every high school department to rework the course catalog. Shannon Gronau and I have completed it and we anticipate it going to students in the next week or so. We will do student registration for next year in late February/Early March. We are also looking at the possibility of some more course offerings at the middle school in an exploratory format.

Plans are well in place for the March 3rd ACT plus writing and the WorkKeys on March 4th. Juniors will meet in small group the week of February 16th to do pre-test preparation and get details of the test days. There will also be incentive in place for the ACT so that students are encouraged to put in their maximum effort. Parents have already be contacted about the impact this has on schedule for 9th, 10th and 12th grade parents.

1. Curriculum/Instruction/Assessment

- **Parent/Teacher Conferences** are going to be held February 24th and 27th. Progress reports were sent home with the students last Friday. The purpose of progress reports is to inform and give meaningful feedback to those invested in the student's learning experience so concerns can be addressed before the end of the grading term.
- A second round of **Non-Violent Crisis Intervention** will be taking place at PES. PES fifth grade teacher, John Knoot, will again facilitate this training.
- We are continuing professional development with the **Stephanie Harvey Comprehension** program. This program is supplementing and helping to fill the gaps that the reading and writing program we are going to next year.
- Measure of Academic Progress (MAP) The winter MAP testing has been completed for PES. We gave the MAP test in September to all 2-6 grade students in reading and math and now we can compare the two scores and check to see if they have improved since then.

At all grade levels a majority of the students have made gains in both reading and math. I also look at is how our students are performing compared to the rest of the nation. A majority of our students are at or above where they need to be, but there are many students who we would like to see perform better. These students have been identified and are currently receiving additional support for improvement. Many of these students identified for additional support have made gains, but not the gains we would like to see.
